CBC: Complete Blood Count: this test gives us a complete evaluation of the red blood cell, white blood cell and platelet number and condition. Many different types of diseases can only be diagnosed using the CBC.

Chemistries: a group of tests used to identify organ malfunction and damage. A smaller or "mini" panel gives us less information about your pet than a "comprehensive" panel.

Urinalysis: changes in the urine can help diagnose a very wide range of problems and is considered essential to any complete diagnosis and health screening. We evaluate the urine in three ways using a urine analyzing machine, dipsticks and direct microscopic visualization.

Thyroid: measures the basic thyroid hormone T4. Hypothyroidism is highly prevalent in older dogs and hyperthyroid is highly prevalent in older cats.

Fecal: a fecal/stool evaluation performed using a flotation technique and a direct staining technique that allow our technicians to best evaluate your pet for parasites and harmful bacteria/protozoa.

Radiographs: commonly known as x-rays. Radiographs allow the Doctor to evaluate the skeletal and soft tissue structures in the chest and abdomen. Five view radiographs are optimal to adequately see the thorax/chest. Three views are dedicated to the chest and two views for the abdomen.

Tonometry: the tonopen is an advanced piece of technology allowing Doctors to measure ocular pressure without any discomfort to the patient. This device can help detect glaucoma, increased pressure inside the eye, in its early stages and allow us to treat earlier.

Blood Pressure Measurement: High blood pressure (hypertension) is seen secondary to many disease problems in dogs and cats and needs to be treated when present. A Doppler measurement of blood pressures also helps to identify kidney disease, heart disease, and hormonal diseases in your pet.
